FROM THE DESK OF MAYOR NIWINSKI

Our Village, similar to most municipalities in Erie County and across the country, is still experiencing the long-term effects of the foreclosure crises that began in 2008. Sloan currently has over fifteen vacant homes that are in the process of bank foreclosure. We have seen some foreclosures take over five years to complete. During this period, our office attempts to work with banks to maintain the property and prevent blight in the immediate area. Unfortunately, many lending institutions refuse to maintain properties until the foreclosure is final. During this process, the listed homeowner is responsible for the maintenance and security of the property. If the bank refuses to cut the grass or keep the building secure and we are unable to locate the owner, the Village Board can authorize our Department of Public Works to maintain them. This past summer, the DPW has been maintain-

ing nine properties. While this can be costly, we believe that the preservation of our neighborhood is a top priority. The Village has also referred several houses to the Buffalo Erie Niagara Land Improvement Corporation (BENLIC). BENLIC is authorized to obtain ownership and rehabilitate properties throughout WNY. Working with BENLIC, we hope to rehabilitate two homes in Sloan during the next year—one on Atlantic Avenue, the other on Roland Street. Occasionally, properties have been vacant for so long that they are beyond rehabilitation. This year, our Code Enforcement Officer and Engineer condemned a structure at 2180 William Street. After completing the lengthy legal requirements, the Board approved the demolition of all structures located at 2180 William St. in July. The current contract Sloan has with Modern

Inc. for refuse and recycling is expiring on October 31, 2014. We are currently requesting bids for a new contract. Some changes that will be taking place after November 1st will be an increase in the number of bulk items that may put out for pick-up. In response to residents' concerns, we have increased the number of bulk items (i.e. furniture) from one item to two items per week. Also, yard waste and grass clippings can be put at the curb in brown paper lawn and leaf bags if they don't fit inside your garbage tote. After the new contract is approved, we will post all updated information on the village website at www.villageofsloan.org. In closing, this winter please help your elderly or disabled neighbors by keeping their sidewalks clear of snow. Our neighborhood is only as good as its neighbors!

REMINDERS

Daylight Saving Time ends on Saturday, November 1st. Don't forget to turn your clocks **BACK** one (1) hour before you go to bed at night.

The winter parking ban goes into effect on November 15, 2014 and continues through April 1, 2015. Violators will be ticketed and/or towed. Parking permits for the village hall or fire department lots must be obtained from Village Hall. Permits are free and currently available.

ALL snow plow drivers **MUST** obtain a snow plow permit for the Village of Sloan. They can be obtained at Village Hall during regular business hours. A valid drivers license, current insurance, and registration is required. There is a \$25 fee.

September is designated as National Preparedness Month. On September 17th, I attended a meeting held by the Erie County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). LEPC works with over 70 agencies in the WNY region to facilitate community collaboration in handling any type of emergency.

LEPC recommends all families to make a plan to reconnect with your family after a disaster whether at home, school or work and practice your plan with all family members involved. Also important is to have a Disaster Supply Kit prepared, which would include basic household items that you, your family,

and pets may need.

To kick-off October as Fire Prevention month, the Sloan Active Hose is participating in the Cheektowaga Town-wide fire prevention event on Saturday, September 27th. Family activities and prevention awareness will take place from noon until 3:00pm, at Cabela's on Walden.

Fall Fire Prevention Tips-

- Change the batteries in your smoke and CO detectors. Test both monthly to verify they are working correctly. All detectors

should be replaced every five years.

- Clean out the lint trap in your dryer regularly and check that your dryer vents properly outside.

- Do not leave your car running inside an attached garage, as this can result in harmful CO fumes in your home.

- In the event of a power outage, run generators only in a well ventilated, outdoor area away from any open doors, windows and vent openings.

- Allow your snow blower and lawnmower to cool down before storing them in your shed or garage.

- Practice an escape plan with your family in the event of an emergency.

FROM GENE BESZCZYNSKI, DPW CHIEF

As fall arrives, our department will pick up all leaves that are raked onto the "headland" area as weather permits. The headland is the grassy area between the sidewalk and curb. Please do not rake any leaves into the street, as it blocks the flow of rainwater into the storm drains. This past summer, we replaced or repaired 14

storm drain inlets that were deteriorated or collapsing. By the end of September, we will begin replacing almost 2000 square foot of sidewalks in various locations in the Village. As time and weather permits, we will also be trimming trees and preparing our snow plowing equipment for winter. Just a reminder and for the safety

of your neighbors, please keep your sidewalks clear of all ice and snow. Additionally, do not throw any snow into the streets as this results in a driving hazard and is actually a violation of Village Code. If you have a plow driver hired for snow removal, they must obtain a snow plow permit from Village Hall.
