FROM THE DESK OF MAYOR FERRUCCI

With every publication of The Sloan Connection, we provide an update on the most pressing matter facing the Village: sanitary sewer infrastructure. The Village is under an Order on Consent from the DEC to reduce Inflow and Infiltration (I&I). Last year, we applied for grant funding to assist in the estimated six million-dollar cost of mandated repairs. We were awarded two grants which will cover approximately 80% of the costs. The remaining funding will be financed through interest-free bonds, resulting in a minimal impact to our taxpayers. As we reduce the infiltration of stormwater into the sanitary system, our annual costs for sewer treatments will diminish. Based on the results of our engineers' house-to-house inspections and smoke testing, many property owners received letters requesting minor repairs to their vent/cleanout caps or downspouts. Several homeowners also received letters advising of their sanitary laterals cracking or collapsing, which allows rainwater to enter and tree roots to infiltrate the system. This fall and moving into 2021, sewer reconstruction, slip lining and manhole rehabilitation will be occurring throughout the Village.

The Village has recently contracted with NYSEG to convert all streetlights from High Intensity Discharge (HID) to LED later this year. These conversions are in line with New York's energy efficiency project "Smart Street Lighting NY", announced by Governor Cuomo last year. The program focuses on converting over 500,000 lights across the state, cutting energy use and saving taxpayer money. Our estimated annual streetlighting bill will decrease approximately 40 to 50%...money that can be used to provide critical municipal services to our residents.

On October 31, 2019, our Refuse & Recycling contract with Modern, Inc. is expiring. We have met with several service suppliers over the last six months to discuss the bid process, increasing costs, the future of the recycling market and more. There is a shift in the worldwide market resulting in low demand for recyclables and a cost for disposal instead of creating a revenue stream. Additionally, the cost for garbage collection and disposal is expected to rise substantially. The Board is reviewing options such as moving to a quarterly pickup of bulk items, extra bag

and bulk tagging systems, user fees for multi-unit apartments etc. In our fall issue of the Sloan Connection, we will outline the new procedures for both garbage and recycling taking effect in November. Although there will be some adjustments for our residents, we are making critical decisions to balance services with their cost to our taxpayers.

We invite everyone to Griffith Park for our Annual Concert Series, which begins on June 27th at 7:00pm. This is a bi-weekly event that continues until August 22nd. While at the park, visit our brand-new splash pad recently installed. We want to thank Assemblywoman Monica Wallace for her substantial grant funding towards this project. The annual Village-wide garage sale will be held on August 24th—please call Village Hall to register your address. On August 29th, we will be hosting a Veterans Event in Griffith Park from 4:30 to 9:00pm. Please review page four for more information. Hope to see you over the summer!

FROM ROBERT SMITH, DPW CREW CHIEF

The past six months have been very busy for our Highway Department. Working with our engineering firm, we have completed inspections of every sanitary manhole in the Village to determine their condition and extent of needed repairs. Griffith Park has a brand-new splash pad for our youth, replacing the 55-year-old wading pool. Along with the new equipment, we have replaced the fence and concrete around the pad, outside the shelter and handball court, which doubles as a stage for our Concerts.

Every year, the Village of Sloan is allocated financial assistance through the Consolidated Highway Improvement Program (CHIPs) by New York State. These funds were used last year for Reiman Street reconstruction. This year, Blick Street and Atlantic Avenue, from Lovejoy to Reiman, will be paved. In the next few months, Erie County Water Authority will be replacing supply lines on Michael, Gierlach, Franklin and a portion of Gates Streets. Next year will see the much-needed paving of Gierlach and Michael.

We would also like to remind everyone that while mowing their lawns, to not blow the clippings into the street. During rain, the clippings wash into the storm drain and create blockages and potential backups to your and neighboring homes.

If you need to dispose of any old tires, they can be recycled at Geiter-Done, located at 300 Greene Street in Lovejoy.

Returning for a second year is the Summer Lunch Program, which provides free meals to any child under the age of 18, regardless of residency. This successful program is made possible by the efforts of Mary Brucz, School District Food Service Manager and through an initiative by the State Education Department. Meals are available Monday through Friday, from 11:45am through
